George Elliss

No evidence was found to indicate that this George Elliss was a US veteran. While several men by the same name were found in various military records (and a few pension records), none of them could be tied to the dates shown on George Elliss' gravemarker. The marker is not a military marker.

While George Elliss was buried in Denton, Texas, no record of a death certificate was found. While several death certificates list George Ellis as the father, it cannot be determined which, if any, of them match.

A George Ellis appeared on the tax records of Denton County, Texas, in 1893, but he was not located in census records although younger generations appear. A George Ellis married Lula Carithers in 1903, but the age of the groom could not be verified. George Elliss found in nearby locations were ruled out because of dates.

There was a George Ellis who drew a VA pension and died 15 April 1909 (no birthdate available), but no facts could be found to determine the gravemarker date is in error. There is a possibility that he was the George Ellis from Indian Territory, but that cannot be substantiated either.

The only George Ellis found whose dates match those on the gravemarker was buried in lowa.

A great deal of time was spent researching this person. Without a corroborating fact (name of spouse, name of parent, name of child, place of birth, type of military service, etc.) any research data provided would be guess work.



(A quick research was conducted to discover the meaning of the markings at the bottom of the marker. They may be printer's marks, or they may refer to ancient or sacred texts of the Old Testament.)
