He was the only casualty of the Civil War buried in Fairview Cemetery. His headstone reads:  
Died for his Country

To the Memory of W H H Addington Born Oct 17, 1840, in Gilmer Co Ga. He was wounded at the Battle of Oostanolla, Indian Territory [sic] on Dec 26, 1861. Died at Fort Gibson Jan 3, 1862, Interd [sic] at this place Feb 4, 1862.

His last words were, tell my mother, "I fell for her. Tell her, I will meet her in Heaven."
