Enlisted in the U.S. Navy on December 7, 1943, where he then served as a gunner mate during World War II. While serving, he toured Australia, India, Philippines, and New Guinea. He was awarded the WWII Victory Medal ETO, Philippine Campaign Medal and Asiatic and Pacific campaign medals. Cason's tour of duty ended May 7, 1946.

### Occupation and any other brief personal or family comments.

"He graduated from Muenster in 1943. He worked for the Santa Fe Railroad and in 1950 he began work for J.R. & Adam Seitz Oil Company. He retired from the company after 49 years. He was a member of the Central Baptist Church. He enjoyed fishing and camping. He died at the Gainesville Health & Rehabilitation".
