William Brown's family moved to Tennessee while he was young (before 1853), and it was there that he married in 1859 and, in 1862, enlisted in the military. In 1880, he and his wife and 8 children lived in Henderson County, Tennessee.

Following the death of his first wife, William remarried in 1897 and was living in Washington County, Tennessee, in 1900 with his wife, 3 daughters, and 3 stepsons.

William brought his family to Texas in 1903. They settled in Denton County, and lived on Rural Route 1, Aubrey, Texas, for the last 23 years of his life.

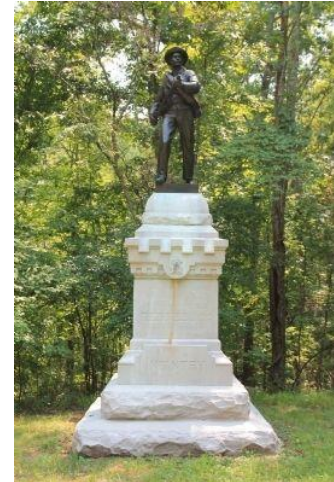
