Civilian: After the Civil War he went to Omaha and drove a freight wagon from Nebraska to Nevada. In 1868 he came to Gainesville where he hauled freight for one year for Cloud and Perry. Then he started a livery and feed business and was a carpenter and butcher until he retired in July 1912. In 1880 he lived in Pct 4, Hood, Cooke County, Texas, and in 1900 to 1920 Gainesville Cooke County, Texas. He was also a Mason, a member of IOOF, a Commander in the Joseph E. Johnston Confederate Veterans Camp, and Department of Agriculture public weigher.
