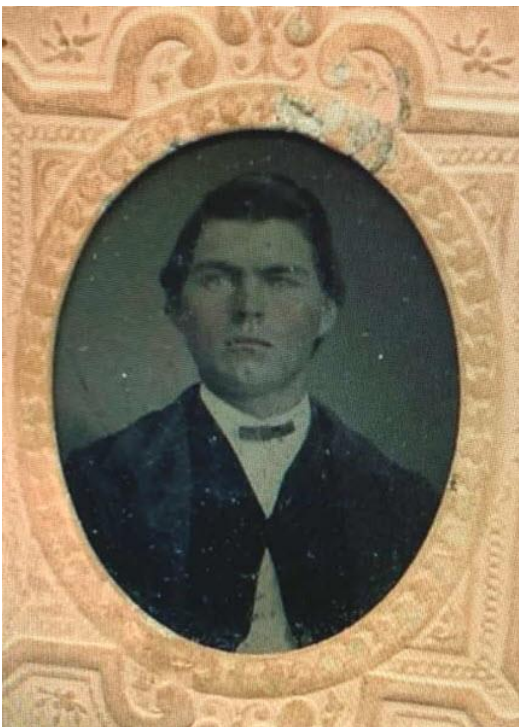

Obituary from Denton Record-Chronicle June 12, 1934, pg 4:

W. Marion McCreless, 86, died at his home in the Chinn Chapel community Tuesday morning at 1 o'clock, following an illness of only a few days. He was a Confederate veteran and a pioneer of Denton County, having lived in the community in which he died since 1872. He was born Sept. 22 in South Carolina, and moved from there to Alabama before coming to Texas.
