

The SS Sea Eagle was re-commissioned as the **USS Custer (APA-40) on** 18 July 1943 and saw heavy duty during World War II, earning five battle stars.

During WWII, the **USS** *Custer* was assigned to the Asiatic-Pacific Theater under the command of Capt. Ralph E. Hansen. It sailed from Norfolk, Virginia, on 11 December 1943, carrying Seabees and arrived at Pearl Harbor on 10 January 1944. The Custer saw action in the Marshall Islands, Saipan, Guam, Leyte, Lingayen Gulf, and Okinawa.
