Military: Virgil began his service in the US Marine Corp on 14 Nov 1925 at the age of 25. He had previously signed his WWI Draft Card at age 18. He served in the USMC from 1924 to 1925.

Civilian: In his civilian life, Virgil worked as a poultry farmer in Denton County, TX. He attended Argyle Public Schools and was a member of the College View Baptist Church.

Family: On 25 Nov 1934, Virgil married Essie Taylor in Denton County, where they raised two sons. Virgil's parents were Samuel Lewis Brown and Frances Parr, both of Denton County.
