Military: Ray was a Private in the US Army during WWI. Baker enlisted on 5 Sep 1918; and was discharged on 22 Nov 1919. Ray served with the 30th Co., 8th Bn., 16th Db.

Civilian: The 1930 census record shows Ray living in Denton with his wife Vera, who was a teacher and his mother. Later, Ray would become an electrician. Texas Instruments was Ray's final employer.
