Glenn married Cheryl Tallman on 5 May 1990 in Canterbury, Connecticut. Glenn had one son, Jeremy Lee. Glenn's grave lies next to both Cheryl's and Jeremy's in Flower Mound Presbyterian Cemetery.

Military: Glenn enlisted in the U. S. Navy on 3 April 1972 at age twenty-one. Served honorably on the U. S. S. *Ticonderoga* aircraft carrier during the Vietnam War. He was discharged on 21 March 1975.
