

JACK RAYMOND ROBINSON

Jack Raymond Robinson was born in Van Alstyne, Grayson County, TX, on 19 Apr 1916, the son of James Russel Robinson (1871-1941) and Lessie Pearl (Wood) Robinson (1882-1964). Jack—or Raymond, as his name was frequently given—was a veteran of the U.S. Army. He served from 02 Jun 1943 until 12 Jan 1946, attaining the rank of Staff Sergeant.

When Raymond was 19 years old, he married Alma Joe Jenkins on 21 Sep 1935 in Lewisville, TX. Together they had one son, Ricky. Raymond and Alma made their home in Grapevine, TX for 45 years, where he worked as an automobile mechanic. Following Alma's death in 1980, Raymond moved to Trenton, Fannin County, TX, where he resided until his death on 31 Aug 1989. At the time of his death, Raymond was survived by his son Ricky and by his second wife, Lottie.

Raymond is buried in Flower Mound Cemetery. Near him are the graves of his wife Alma; his parents; his brother, John; and his sister, Royce Jean.
