Before his time as commissioner, spent 15 years on the Argyle School Board (from 1950 to 1965)
and served as a member of the Argyle Volunteer Fire Department. Member of the Knights of
Pythias, The American Legion, The Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Argyle First Baptist Church, and
served as president of the Denton County Livestock Association.
