Family: Clarence V. Wellborn was the son of Robert Wellborn and Otis Smith. He married Patricia Mahuata Irons, though the date of their marriage is unknown. They shared two children: a daughter, Linda Laverne, born in 1944, and a son, Jerry Vie, born in 1946.

Military: Clarence V. Wellborn's life was marked by his dedicated service in the Army during World War II. Enlisting on September 24, 1942, he committed himself to his country's cause. Clarence served in the 422nd Infantry Regiment as a field artillery man. His service lasted until October 11, 1945, when he was honorably discharged. In late 1945, he sailed back from Le Havre, France, with his regiment, concluding his service upon reaching New York.

Civilian: Before the war, Clarence V. Wellborn worked as a machinist in Dallas at a welding and machine repair shop. He enjoyed working with his hands, and after the war, he returned to his profession as a machinist, this time for the city water plant in Dallas.
