Family: Charles D. Whisenhunt was the son of Carl Douglas Whisenhunt and Minnie Louisa Davis. He was one of four children with two brothers, Joe and Jimmy, and one sister, Janice. He married Mae Womack, after serving in the Korean war. They had two wonderful children together: Tondra Gayle Whisenhunt, born on July 27, 1960, and Sammi Lee, born on February 6, 1963.

Military: Born to a WWII veteran, Charles was exposed to the military from a young age. This upbringing inspired him to serve his country in the next conflict. At the young age of 18, Charles served in the Korean War for the United States Navy. He began his military service on October 2, 1952, with an enlistment in the U.S. Army. His service concluded on October 29, 1956.

Civilian: Charles Douglas Whisenhunt appeared on the census of April 1, 1940, in Parks, Stephens County, OK, at the age of 6, attending school and having completed the 1st grade. In the 1950s census, he was still in school, nearing the completion of his high school education. Shortly thereafter, about six months after his 18th birthday, Charles enlisted in the Navy.
