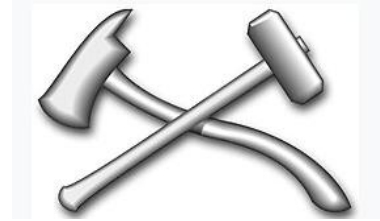

Military: Ronald served in the U.S. Navy from 16 Feb 1956 to 01 Oct 1959 and then immediately joined the Naval Reserve where he served from 02 Oct 1959 to 23 Jan 1970. His rank was DC1 (Damage Controlman First Class). DCs are responsible for firefighting, ship stability, and repairs to mitigate damage to ships that occurs during combat or non-combat situations.

Civilian: As shown on his draft registration card dated 07 Oct 1959, Ronald had two tattoos: on his left arm, a heart and panther; on his right arm, an eagle and USN.

Family: Ronald was the son of John Henry Bullens and May Philomena Costello.
He was married in 1960 to Lorraine Ann Robbins.
At the time of his death, he had been married to Betsy Nadine Knight for nearly eleven years.
