Military: Enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in July 1944. Completed basic training at Parris Island, South Carolina, he was transferred to San Francisco for deployment to Naval Base Banika on Banika Island, part of the Russell Islands group in the Solomon Islands. Banika served as a major support base for U.S. naval operations in the Pacific, with extensive supply depots, repair facilities, a hospital, and a seaplane base. Edwin served there until his honorable discharge in February 1946.

Civilian: Graduated from Denton High School in 1938.
Before enlisting in the Marine Corps, worked as a laborer.
By 1950, employed in the soil conservation field.
By 1958, entered federal service as a civil servant.
At the time of his death, employed by the U.S. General Services Administration.

Family: Edwin married his first wife, Hazel, in 1940, and together they had two daughters.
Following Hazel's death in 1984, he married Bonnie and made his home in Wapanucka, Oklahoma.
