Military: Three years in United States Navy during World War II, including two years in the Pacific.
By October 1945, aboard the destroyer USS *Niblack* (DD-424) as a Seaman Second Class (S2c), V-6,
and remained aboard the ship into 1946.
Returned to active naval service when reactivated during the Korean War.
World War II Victory Medal and the Korean Service Medal.
Honorably discharged from the United States Navy.

Civilian: As a teenager, worked long hours on the family farm along Justin-Krum Road alongside his parents
and siblings.
Active in the Argyle 4-H Club and, in 1942, was elected Secretary-Treasurer.
As the war continued, he pledged to support the war effort by growing food, helping others, and
purchasing war bonds and stamps whenever possible.

Family: Known throughout his life by the nickname "Tooter", a much-loved member of the large Faught
family in the Argyle area of Denton County.
Following his wartime service, he returned to the Denton area, where he remained connected to
his family and the local farming community until his death in 1996.
