Military: Charles was a WW II veteran. He enlisted as a Private in the U.S. Marine Corps on 13 Aug 1940 in Battery D, 3" Anti-aircraft Gun, Second Defense Battalion in San Diego, CA. He was later promoted to Sergeant and served in the USMC until 12 Aug 1946.

Civilian: After his service in the USMC, Charles returned to civilian life as an auto mechanic in the Denton County community.

Family: Charles' parents were Charles Homer Garrett and Opal Brown Garrett.
On 02 Jun 1943, he married Lura Lucille Wood.
They had three children together and lived in Denton, TX.
He died of natural causes at the age of 80.
