Military: Godfrey served in the U.S. Navy during WW II as a Signalman 1st Class Petty Officer. Seaman of this historic class specialized in visual communications such as flashing light transmissions, flag hoist signaling, and semaphore. Flag semaphore is a system where an operator holds two flags (usually red and yellow square-shaped) and extends their arms at specific angles to spell out letters and numbers. Godfrey was wounded in action during his naval service.

Civilian: Godfrey worked for the maintenance department at Texas Woman's University for 30 years. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Argyle.

Family: Godfrey was one of three sons of Lennie D. Palmer and Loveta Louise Carter. Godfrey had two marriages.
At the time of his death: one son, one stepdaughter, two stepsons, and two grandchildren.
