Military: Once he had graduated from Tioga High School, Ed enlisted in the United States Marine Corps where he achieved the rank of Private First Class (PFC).

Civilian: After completing his Marine Corps enlistment, Ed joined the Denton Police Force. On 15 Dec 1964, he and a fellow policeman survived after being shot in the line of duty. Both officers spent weeks of recovery in Flow Hospital. During his service in the force Ed was a well-respected officer who received awards for his marksmanship. He retired as a Police Captain in 1982 and went on to enjoy retirement as a cattle rancher in Tioga, Texas.

Family: Ed's parents were Fred Reynolds and Ruby Lee Gill.
In 1959 he married Barbara Anne McKnight and in 1968 he was married to Sue Wallace.
He had four sons in his marriage with Sue and one in his first marriage.
