Family: Percy was the son of Benjamin Percy "Frosty" Young and Illa Mae Pate.
His siblings were brothers Edgar, Louis, and Jessie and sister Frances.
On 14 May 1965, Weldon married Flora Jean Stanphill. The couple had one son, Weldon "Jack".
