Military: Guy joined the Navy in 1973, where he served as an Aviation Anti-Submarine Warfare Sensor Operator, a member of the Search and Rescue Aircrew, and an Intelligence Specialist. Guy was deployed to Vietnam in 1975 and to the Persian Gulf during the Iran Hostage Crisis. He received the National Defense Service Medal, Air Crewman of the Year award, and several firearms expert awards during his tenure. After his 1976 discharge from active duty, Guy transferred to the Naval Reserve until 1982. He again joined the Naval Reserve from 1988-1992 and served in a support position at Hensley Field in Dallas during Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. His hobbies were fishing, horses, shooting sports, and camping.

Civilian: Guy worked for 21 years in the Denton Police Department and later as an investigator for the Denton County Sheriff's Department.

Family: Investigator Williamson was the son of William John Williamson and Margaret Jane Staffa. On 24 Jan 1981 Guy married Teresa B. Richardson. The couple had one daughter, Emily Anne.
