Legion, now in the southeastern part of Kerrville, is on the Guadalupe River in east central Kerr County. The area became known as Legion in the early 1920s when the TX Dept of the Am Legion for a short time owned the land and the unfinished buildings that later became the US Veteran's Administration Hospital. By 1970, Legion had been absorbed into the Kerrville city limits.

Family: Father was Willis Edward Calvert from Kentucky and mother was Mattie Lucille Card from Alabama. On Aug 11, 1920, he married Ruby Harris. They had one son, Clarence Edwin. There are more than 20 Calvert family members buried at Chinn's Chapel Cemetery.

Military: US Army, Sgt Co. B 109<sup>th</sup>, Ammunition TRS, Mr. Calvert also served as a ship's cook for two years.

Civilian: Clarence worked as a mechanic at a garage in Lewisville
