Civilian: "As the 19th century drew to a close, Chinn's Chapel was regularly served by circuit

riders, appointed first from the Gainesville District and then from the Dallas-Denton District. George W. Jackson (1827-1906), Methodist preacher, school administrator, and pioneer merchant from Tennessee settled near Chinn's Chapel, in 1882. A popular revival leader, he delivered his "soul-stirring oratorios" and spread the practice of shaped note singing, using tunes from a Methodist hymnal, written by his circuit-riding father, John Batchelor Jackson, in 1838. George W. Jackson traveled with his wife, Sarah Ann, who brought her pump organ, and their four sons, who were known, as "The Jackson Quartet" or The Singing Jackson Boys." (Quoted from Texas CSA on FAG. In 1880, we find the Jackson family in Denton County owning 224 acres of land.)
