Civilian: Current day residents recognize the historical marker "Flower Mound", which is a dome-shaped hill blooming with wildflowers. The mound rises 50' above the surrounding prairie. Mr. Beavers purchased this land from Edy, the widow of John R Wizwell. The mound remained in the Beavers family well into the twentieth century.
