Military: US Navy during WWI. Enlisted on 22 Apr 1918; discharged 30 Sep 1921.

Civilian: In his 40s, worked at Industrial Tile Company in Tulsa, Oklahoma.
By the 1950 census, owned his own business as a tile contractor.
Settled in Flower Mound; cast member of *Sweet Flower Mound*, annual historical play about the Denton County community
Served as Mayor Pro Tem from 1974-1979. Contributed greatly to his town. He was a Mason.
Served on the President's Council on Youth Opportunity for almost 20 years.
Lifetime member of the American Association of Sheriff's Poses and Riding Clubs.

Special Note: Dedicated to preserving the history of The Flower Mound and protecting it from property development. It is a 12.5-acre site located on the NE corner of FM3040 and FM2499. This site is a native Tall Grass Prairie segment of the Great American Black Land Prairie. Nineteenth century settlers named this landmark, The Flower Mound, for the profusion of wildflowers that grow there.
Led a group of dedicated citizens in purchasing the site and placing it into a permanent land conservancy under the care of The Flower Mound Foundation; corporation's first chairman.
In 1984 it was named a State of Texas Historic Site.
