Military: Civil War – Gray served with the calvary group from Dallas, possibly under Captain McGinnis (see Pension Application). Applied for a pension less than a year from his death indicating that he made \$8/month from the US Government as a Veteran of the Indian War. At the time, unable to work due to a 'rupture and old age.'

Civilian: Farmer. By 1850 had moved his family to Texas.
