Civilian: In 1950, living in Philadelphia. In 1947, among a group of Veterans seeking independent cab permits. The Public Utility Commission held hearings with The Yellow Cab Co and the operators. The family moved to Arizona in 1983. By 1986, Anthony had moved to Texas.
