Military:

Beginning in Sept 1861, served as a Private with Company G, 30th Georgia Infantry during the Civil War.
Applied for a pension in Jul 1913 while living in Lewisville, Denton County, Texas.
Wounded while in the Battle of Chickamauga, which was fought on Sept 18-20, 1863. This battle involved the second-highest number of casualties after the Battle of Gettysburg.
Discharged at Atlanta, Georgia at the close of the war.

Civilian: Farmer. Moved to Texas in December 1882.
