Civilian: After graduating from North Texas State Teacher's College in 1949, he went to work for Pioneer Airlines. Floyd worked for Delta Airlines as an aircraft mechanic approximately ten years. Later in his career, Floyd would become a flight engineer. Their family had a love of flying so much, they bought an airplane and built a runway and hangar in the back pasture. Besides flying, Floyd also enjoyed riding motorcycles, hunting, and traveling.
