Military: Served in the U.S. Army during the final months of World War II, enlisting on 07 July 1945, just weeks before Japan announced its surrender on 15 August, marking the end of major hostilities in the Pacific.
Received the World War II Victory Medal in recognition of his honorable service.

Civilian: Very active in his local community as a teenager. Founding member of the Denton High School Future Farmers of America Bronco Chapter and served as its president in 1938 and 1939. Enjoyed sports, playing basketball and baseball for the school teams and competing in track. In a 1939 interview with the local newspaper, shared his plans to attend Texas A&M University, where he hoped to study vocational agriculture and become a research chemist. Following his wartime service, worked in soil conservation, building dams and watersheds. He and his family lived in the Texas Panhandle for a time before eventually returning to the Denton area. Wherever he lived, his commitment to serving others continued. Lifelong Mason, member of the Lions Club, and a Sunday School teacher for more than sixty years.

Family: Married Frances in September 1946. Together they raised three daughters.
Survived by his wife, two daughters, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.
