Military: From 04 Dec 1942 to 13 Oct 1945 Roy served in the U.S. Navy during WW II. He was a RD2 Radarman Second Class Petty Officer, a position responsible for operating and maintaining shipboard radar and electronic warfare equipment.

Civilian: When 25-year-old Roy registered for the draft in October of 1940 he was employed at State Reserve Life Insurance Company in Fort Worth. In the 1950 Census, Roy and his wife Mabel lived in Lubbock, Texas, where he was employed in the insurance industry. Roy graduated from Texas Tech University in Lubbock.

Family: Roy was born into a large family with parents Charles Wilborn Krebbs and mother Elva Pearl Speakes. He was the second to the youngest of nine children. He married Mabel Louise Morris, who preceded him in death and is buried next to him in PMC.
