Civilian: When 41-year-old Frank registered for the draft in 1941, he was employed at Home State Insurance company. Later in life Frank worked for the United States Postal Service for twenty years. During the last fifteen years of his life, Frank and his wife lived in Keller, Texas, where they attended the Keller Baptist Church. Frank was a Mason.

Family: Frank was the son of William Robert Larkin and Sarah Elizabeth "Bettie" Whaley. He married Lillian Margaret Byrd.
