Military: John served as a soldier of the Confederacy for three years during the Civil War. He was a Corporal in Company D of the 17th Texas Cavalry, Moore's Regiment.

Civilian: Census records from 1860-1880 show that John's occupation was farming. Before his marriage in 1854, John worked as a bricklayer.

Family: On 11 Jul 1854 John was married to Willmirth Caison in Rusk County, Texas.
The couple had a son they named Wiliam Henry Pennington who became a physician.
