Military: James enlisted in the Union Army on 02 Sep 1864. He began his service in Company C of the 6th Mounted Infantry as a Private, but on 12 Sep 1864 he was promoted to Sergeant. James mustered out on 30 Jun 1865.

Civilian: Census records from 1870, 1880, and 1900 show that James was a farmer.

Family: James was the son of John Taylor and Mary C. Dennis. He was one of 12 children. In 1868 James and Matilda Laticia Clementine Roberts were joined in marriage. This marriage produced 6 children.
